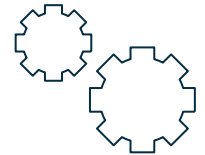

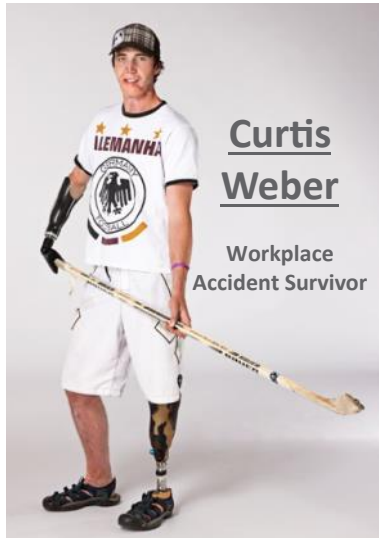

## Wednesday Keynote Speaker



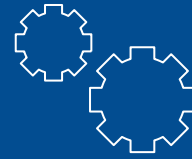
