

Fee and royalty rates

Fees and royalties will be charged as follows:

Charge	2020 Production	2021 Production
Annual Fee – Class A Licences and Aggregate Permits authorized to remove more than 20,000 tonnes annually	20.6 cents/tonne or \$718, whichever is greater	20.8 cents/tonne or \$724, whichever is greater
Annual Fee – Class B Licences or Aggregate Permits authorized to remove 20,000 tonnes or less annually	20.6 cents/tonne or \$358, whichever is greater	20.8 cents/tonne or \$361, whichever is greater
Wayside Permit Issuance Fee	20.6 cents/tonne or \$718, whichever is greater	20.8 cents/tonne or \$724, whichever is greater
Minimum Royalty (except as noted below)	52.1 cents/tonne	52.6 cents/tonne
Minimum Royalty for phased-in aggregate sites with Mining lease (i.e. only those removing aggregate, other than sand or gravel, that is property of the Crown from land that is subject to a mining lease entered into before May 10, 2017)	52.1 cents/tonne	52.6 cents/tonne

Where do fees go?

Fees collected from licences, wayside permits and aggregate permits will be distributed approximately as follows:

- 3% to the Aggregate Resources Trust for rehabilitation and research
- 61% to the local municipality in which the site is located
- 15% to the upper-tier municipality in which the site is located
- 21% to the Crown (minimum)

For 2021 production, that means:

3% or .62 cents to TOARC
61% or 12.69 cents to lower tier
15% or 3.12 cents to upper tier
21% or 4.37 cents to province
